

Report Scams and Fraud

If you are a survivor of Kentucky April storms, straight-line winds, tornadoes, floods, landslides and mudslides, you may also be a target of con artists and criminals who try to obtain money or steal personal information.

If you believe you are the victim of a scam, report it immediately to:

- your local police or sheriff's department, or
- call the Office of the Attorney General at 502-696-5485, or
- visit Natural Disaster Scams - Kentucky Attorney General.

To file a fraud complaint, go online to Scam Report (kentucky.gov).

If you suspect fraudulent activity involving FEMA, you can:
